Digging Deeper

In our fast-paced culture, it's easy to be impacted by the sermon you hear at church on Sunday... only to forget about it by Monday. To make this message "stick" we created Digging Deeper. It contains questions related directly to today's sermon, so that you can process and apply what you heard at church. Take some time this week to go through these questions by yourself, in your small group, with a friend, your family, or your roommate.

- 1. Icebreaker March 16th marked the 2nd Sunday of Lent. What are you fasting from during Lent? How is it going? Did you "cheat" at all this week? How much do you miss the food/activity/etc. you are fasting from?
- 2. Is there anything you heard in this week's message or experienced in this week's service that was an "a ha" moment, something significant for you?
- 3. Were you ever taught that it is not always God's will to heal people? If so, how has that teaching impacted your ability to ask God for healing for yourself and others?
- 4. A Key Idea shared in today's sermon was this: "We will not be able to place our trust in God to do something (like healing) if we are not certain of His willingness to do it." What are your thoughts on this?
- 5. In order to believe in the core of your being that God's will is that all are healed, we need to saturate ourselves with the life of Jesus as portrayed in Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John. Take time to read the 11 passages listed below where it says Jesus healed, not some, but all (Matthew 4:23, Matthew 4:24, Matthew 8:16, Matthew 9:35, Matthew 12:15, Matthew 14:35-36, Mark 6:56, Luke 4:40, Luke 6:17-19, Luke 10:10-11, Acts 10:37-38). How did reading these passages impact you?
- 6. Read Mark 1:40-41. You may believe it is God's will to heal people -- that He says "I will" when others ask Him to be healed -- but you may not think it is God's will to heal YOU of a particular sickness or disease you are battling. Have you ever found yourself thinking these thoughts? Why or why not?
- 7. Read Matthew 4:23-24. Who is someone in your life whom you desperately want to be healed either physically, emotionally, or spiritually? Spend some time praying for that person right now.

Action Step: During the season of Lent, read through the four gospels from start to finish and find the 41 distinct instances where Jesus heals or teaches on healing.

Key Verses:

And a leper came to him, imploring him, and kneeling said to him, "If you will, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand and touched him and said to him, "I will; be clean." - Mark 1:40-41 (ESV)
